


Lake Washington Regional Park Trails



Bauer's Marsh Trail

Surface Type: Mowed Grass

Length: 1 mile

Character: Travels the edge of crop fields and skirts along bluffs, a large central marsh, and a marshy woodland area.

Campground Trail

Surface Type: 10' wide Gravel / Mowed Grass

Length: 1/2 mile

Character: Travels along a marsh great for bird watching.

Canoe Trail

Surface Type: Mowed Grass

Length: 1/8 mile

Character: Provides a connection between the parking lot and community room to the dam structure at the Shanaska Creek outlet on Lake Washington. This trail is often used by fishing people.

Dock Trail

Surface Type: Mowed Grass / Soil

Length: 1/4 mile

Character: Travels along the bluff edge and onto a highpoint jetting into Lake Washington. It also provides a connection to the fishing dock.

Shanaska Creek Trail:

Surface Type: Soil

Length: 3/4 mile

Character: Paralleling Shanaska Creek, this heavily wooded trail passes over the creek via two wooden bridges giving a person a good view of the stream. The sound of flowing water nearby is often present

Walnut Woods Trail:

Surface Type: Soil

Length: 1/3 mile

Character: This trail offers connections to the southern portion of the park and travels along a grove of walnut trees.

Washington Woods Trail

Surface Type: Soil

Length: 1/3 mile

Character: It travels in the low lake-edge marshes below the bluff. Provides a connection to the neighborhood along the south border of the park.
