

Lanesburgh Township Annual Meeting  
Tuesday, March 11, 2025 Meeting Minutes

The Annual Meeting of the Town of Lanesburgh was held on Tuesday, March 11, 2025 at the Lanesburgh Town Hall. Clerk Liz Krocak called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m.

Supervisors present were Mark Verhoeven, Tony Kubes and Chris Giesen, Treasurer Rose Rynda and Clerk Liz Krocak.

Clerk Krocak was elected Moderator on a motion from Chris Giesen second by Mark Verhoeven. Motion carried 20-0

Clerk Krocak read the 2024 Annual Meeting Minutes. A motion was made by Tony Kubes seconded by Chris Giesen to approve annual meeting minutes. Motion carried 20-0

Clerk Krocak read the treasurers report of bank and investment balances as of December 31, 2024. Motion by Mark Verhoeven second by Tony Kubes to approve the treasurer's report. Motion carries 20-0

Clerk Krocak read the Board of Audit Report as posted prior to the meeting. Motion by Tony Kubes second by Chris Giesen to approve. Motion carried 20-0

Road work recap for 2024 – Apply gravel where needed. Crack fill and Seal Coating of paved roads was not done. The cost of gravel has increased to \$14.40/ton. Ditch cleaning and culvert repairs were made where needed. The road project at ROLLING MEADOWS was completed. The township paid road work invoices during construction and reimbursed itself after the sale of the bond. Total cost of the project was \$367,049.62. \$25,049.62 was paid by the township to replace the culvert in the development. \$133,000.00 was prepaid by 14 property owners with the balance being a \$209,000 General Obligation Subordinate Service District Bond, Series 2024A. This is a 10 year bond with payment beginning in August 2025.

Road work for 2025 ---Whether or not to do Seal Coating, this year will be decided at the annual road inspection. Crack fill all paved roads. Apply gravel where needed. The annual Road Inspection is set for April 10<sup>th</sup> at 4pm.

Set Levies for 2025, Payable in 2026:

Mark Verhoeven made a motion and seconded by Chris Giesen that the following suggested sums of money be raised by the tax upon the taxable property in Lanesburgh Township for 2025 would be \$ 347,000. This represents no increase from the previous year. The suggested breakdown is as listed below and will be finalized in August. Motion carries 4-0

General Fund	\$ 66,000
Road & Bridge Fund	\$200,000
New Prague Fire	\$ 61,500
Montgomery Fire	\$ 19,500

Communications:

A culvert permit (\$50.00) and a dust control policy are on file and posted on the township hall board. Krocak will post the Dust Control policy in the legal newspaper in May. Any damage to roads treated with Dust Control (by the Township grader) will be pro-rated. Grading will begin again after October 1. The Town Board reiterated that notices are mailed to owner of properties in which right of way encroachment has occurred, either by a field or landscaping.

Right of Way Permit \$100.

Reimbursement for damaged mail boxes will be \$75.

Lanesburgh is a Mail Ballot Precinct. Official Polling Place is the office of the Le Sueur County Auditor-Treasurer at 88 S Park Ave, Le Center, MN.

The New Prague Times and the Montgomery Messenger will be where public notices are published as well as a notice posted outside the town hall.

The next Annual Meeting was ordered to be held on Tuesday, March 10, 2026 at 6:00 pm at 31498 State Highway 13, New Prague, MN. In case of bad weather it will be the following Tuesday. Mark Verhoeven made a motion and seconded by Tony Kubes. Motion carries 20-0.

The annual meeting was adjourned at 7:40 p.m. on motion made by Mark Giesen and seconded by Mark Verhoeven. Motion carries 20-0
